The private sector is a major source of modern contraception

Modern contraception users who obtained method from private or public sectors (2005 – 2012)







Is this global role of the private sector the same across type of methods?



In Asia, private sector has played a larger role in provision of short-acting methods than in the provision of LARC and PM









We observe the same pattern in the LAC region

Short-acting methods




LARC and PM






In sub-Saharan Africa, the private sector plays an important role as well, especially for short-acting methods






LARC and **PM**






In the three regions, the private sector has a strong presence in the provision of short-acting methods





The public sector is the main provider of injectables






Who is accessing the private sector for modern contraceptives?



Short-acting methods: a substantial proportion among poor women








^{*} Lowest two wealth quintiles

Across all regions, young women (15-19 years old) rely more on the private sector for contraceptives

Working with the private sector to get to FP20/20

- The private sector plays an important role in the provision of modern contraception, especially short-acting methods.
- A substantial proportion of poor women obtain their shortacting methods from the private sector.
- Youth, particularly 15 to 19-year-olds, rely heavily on the private sector for modern contraceptives.
- With its field programs, the SHOPS project focused on increasing full method choice through greater provision of injectables, LARC, and PM.
